



We were honoured to welcome one of our own, Colonel Ned Campion, as our guest speaker at our September Open Meeting.

The contribution of the Army Equitation School to the success of Irish Showjumping is legendary. Names like Ringrose, Kiely, Campion, McMahon, Power, Mullins and Ledingham have become household words wherever the sport of showjumping is mentioned. Among the legendary partnerships of horse and rider from the Army Equitation School which spring to mind are Rockbarton (Lt. Col. Gerry Mullins); Kilbaha (Comdt. John Ledingham); Loch an Easpaig (Col. Billy Ringrose); and Garrai Eoin (Col. Ned Campion).

Ned represented Ireland in the Mexico Olympics; in no less than 65 Nations Cups; and in both World & European Championships. He was Chef d'Equipe to the Irish Showjumping Team at the Olympics in Barcelona, Atlanta & Athens, and Team Manager at the Sydney Olympics. He is former Secretary General of the Equestrian Federation of Ireland (EFI).

In his usual unassuming way, Ned delivered a most enjoyable 'behind the scenes' insight into a long and distinguished career, from his childhood in Rathdowney; his introduction to horses; his career in the army equitation school, and his many experiences in international showjumping. A most memorable and enjoyable evening.
