

Wednesday 19th March Guest Speaker, Anna May McHugh, MD, National Ploughing Association



We were delighted to welcome Anna May McHugh, MD of the National Ploughing Association (NPA) as our Guest Speaker at the launch of our Calendar of Events in September. Anna May has literally devoted her life to excellence in the field in her capacity as the long serving MD of the National Ploughing Association.

In a most enjoyable address, she recounted her own involvement with the association dates to 1951 when her grandfather suggested her as an assistant to the then director, JJ Bergin. JJ passed away in 1958, but Anna May just kept going. From tillage farming stock, the Brennans, she married into a tillage family, combining her NPA work with the busy life of a tillage farmer's wife, and becoming MD of the Association in 1973.

These days, Anna May, operates in tandem with daughter, Anna Marie. There is no denying their organisation the NPA has adapted with remarkable success to changed times, and is a unique phenomenon in the farming world – at home and abroad. In the process, Anna May has become something of a legend as a result of her unstinting work for the NPA.

She has spent all her life within a two to three mile radius within Co Laois, close to Athy. A onetime camogie player with caps for her county, on the evening with us, Anna May enjoyed renewing acquaintances with a number of our members with whom she grew up and/or went to school.

In expressing our appreciation, a presentation (including our history book and hurley) was made by our Chairman, Gerry Thompson.























In her closing remarks, Anna May invited members to consider a trip to the National Ploughing Championships in Ratheniska, near Stradbally in September. It didn't take much persuasion!


