

REFLECTIONS by Jim Masterson





The Laois Association lost a great friend when the co-celebrant for many years of our annual Ecumenical Service, Fr. P.J. Cunningham died at the Carmelite Friary, Gort Mhuire on the 10th May 2017 after a short illness which he bore with patience and serenity. His interest in our Association, his warmth & gentleness and his wonderful playing of his beloved tin whistle at our services will be fondly remembered by all our members.

Patrick John Cunningham was the 3rd eldest of eight children born to Elizabeth and Patrick Cunningham at Timahoe, Co. Laois, his mother's home parish. The family later moved to Mountmellick, his father's home town. He attended primary school there and often told me I was the first person to tell him the 2nd World War had ended (May 1945). We shared the same birthday - his 28/02/1936, mine – 28/02/1938. After primary school, PJ went as a boarder to Terenure College. On passing the Leaving Cert. he joined the Carmelite Order. After his first professions, he moved to Gort Mhuire and began his studies at UCD where he graduated with a BA degree in Irish & French. Having completed a HDip, he began teaching in Terenure College in1964, and was ordained on 12th July 1964. He taught there until 1970 when he was appointed to Knocktopher. Co. Kilkenny, also administering in nearby Ballyhale where he made lifetime friends with famous hurling families – the Fennellys, the Reids and the Sheflins. He later served in Kildare town and Moate, Co. Westmeath, returning to Gort Mhuire in 2001. P.J. was a great friend to our family over the years having first called on his bicycle to our home in Swords where he blessed us and our home on the 8th May 1967. He was a frequent visitor after that and Rosaleen would always make scones and an apple tart which he would take back to Gort Mhuire to share with the other priests. He performed the marriage ceremonies of three of our children and christened most of our nine grandchildren.

P.J. loved nature – birds, flowers & shrubs and he would spend hours in the garden in deep contemplation and prayer. He loved swimming and most days – winter or summer – he would swim at the 40 Foot in Sandycove. P.J. was always very pleasant company, had knowledge of most subjects, was very obliging and even-tempered. He had a great gift for remembering folk and making connections, was never judgmental and all manner of people would be quite at home with him.

Our family miss him very much but get great solace as we feel he is in heaven and will intercede for us there. He is survived by his sister Lily (Abbeyleix) and brother Larry (Youghal).

We are indebted to Rev'd Nigel Pierpoint for leading a very moving and reflective Ecumenical Service for our Association's members on 20th November last – remembering, in particular, Fr. P.J.

REFLECTIONS



The Association also lost a longstanding stalwart and former Officer with the untimely death on the 29th Dec. 2017 of friend to so many of us, Tony Brophy, after a very short illness. Tony was our Treasurer for many years, a duty he always carried out with absolute dilligence, and was always a willing helper whenever called upon to help to run events - not to speak of the amount of enjoyment he gave us at so many sessions with his wonderful musicianship.

The following reflections are taken from the homily by Fr. Martin Delaney at Tony's funeral Mass "I want to begin this homily today by sharing with you a thought I have had over the last few days. I was thinking that when Tony goes to heaven in these days and he meets St. Peter, Tony will have a distinct advantage over so many of us. That is the fact that St. Peter and Tony will have something unique in common, they have both been gatekeepers at very important places. For those of you who may not know, the last ten years of Tony's career in An Garda Siochána were spent on duty at the gates of Leinster House.

"Tony was born on the 7th of September 1954 to Edward and Margaret Brophy of Bealady. Five days later he was baptized Anthony Pius Mary Brophy. I think it may have been that Pope Pius XII was thought to be dying in those months. I think it is fair to say that even though Tony's work with An Garda Siochána brought him to live in Louth, Dublin, Waterford and Kilkenny he remained a loyal son of Laois and Rathdowney all his life. While in Dublin he became an active member of the Laois Association and of course in recent years, he and Catherine built a beautiful home back in his native Bealady. As Tony now crosses the threshold into eternal life surely one of the things he must be most looking forward to is being reunited with his beloved Catherine".

On behalf of the President, Chairman, Officers and Members of the Association, we extend our deepest sympathies to Tony's children, Michelle & Colm, grandchild Jamie, his brothers and sisters - Phyllis (Sr. Dolores), Elsie, Ted, Declan and Gay, and the extended Brophy family.

It is also with deep sadness & regret that we record the loss of loved ones by several members during 2017 remembering, in particular: Former member, Brendan Hogan; Mary Butler (sister of our Secretary, Michael Butler); Donal Flanagan (brother of our Vice President, Mary Doyle) and Pauline Carroll (sister of Rosaleen Masterson). We extend our heartfelt thoughts and sympathies to them all.
